The LUUG has been fortunate enough to acquire, over the years, a sizeable infrastructure. We have

- colocation in Whittemore, with a gigabit uplink and at least half a rack to ourselves
- at least seven physical host machines of varying power
- sweet ansible + docker setups for easily making new Virtual
 Machines and spinning up containerized apps
- free allocation access to the ECE /22 IPv4 range
- (hopefully) a bunch of wannabe sysadmins ready to break stuff

- an Iodine portal, to proxy network traffic through DNS. lets you use the internet at places with public Wi-Fi without signing up.
- probably more stuff that I forgot (this list is plenty long anyway)

So what does this mean for the average (prospective) member?

- we host personal VMs/VPSs if members request them, entirely for free
 - you can have a *.vtluug.org subdomain, if you want
- ► stick whatever you want on the NFS share (so long as it's at least *mostly* legal)
- anything that can run as a docker container can be hosted immediately, no questions asked
 - we can help you turn your thing into a docker image, if you want. just ask!
- something that requires its own VM/machine is fine too, just ask an officer for sysadmin permissions

2.2. Infrastructure and (You)



- 2. what we have done
- you can be a sysadmin (aka root on all our boxes) so long as you
 - ▶ act within the bounds of reasonability. taking everything down on accident because your rm -rf slipped is **fine**, snooping people's IRC sessions isn't
 - ▶ don't make trouble for the club. a tor intermediate relay is fine, your illegal warez site is not. remember, we run off the university network.
- don't be scared to ask, though!
